Cutting through the red tape: the importance of vision and leadership

The Hon Jeffrey Kennett AC

To talk to Jeff Kennett is to know that this is a man with vision and a born leader. But how would he tackle the complexities now being faced as we try to house an Australian population that is destined to grow to 35 million? This controversial and entertaining look at leadership and Australia going forward is sure to be a highlight of the conference.

The Hon Jeff Kennett was elected to the Victorian Parliament in 1977 where he remained for the following 23 years. Under Mr Kennett's premiership, Victoria earned the reputation of being Australia's most reformist state. His government implemented numerous reforms and as Victoria grew in confidence Mr Kennett's national popularity soared to the extent that he was widely regarded as Australia's strongest leader during this period. Mr Kennett is currently Chairman of a range of companies as well as the Beyond Blue organisation and the Hawthorn Football Club. He was awarded the Companion of the Order of Australia in 2005.

11.00 - 11.45 Just how big are we talking? Mining investment and population growth

Sam Walsh AO , CEO Iron Ore & Australia, Rio Tinto

If you weren't interested in mining before you will be now! Australia's thriving resources sector is the country's largest single export sector and in 2006-07 accounted for approximately 49 per cent of total goods and services exports. During the period, the minerals and petroleum industries produced over eight per cent of Australia's GDP and accounted for 63 per cent of Australia's merchandise export earnings. Current ABS business investment data for the first quarter showed miners expect to boost spending by 86 per cent to \$92bn in 2011-12 from a year earlier, while investment in sectors like manufacturing is expected to rise just 1.9 per cent in the same period. Sam Walsh unpacks this huge industry that underpins the Australian economy and will drive demand for at least 400,000 new jobs in the next decade.

Sam Walsh was appointed chief executive of the Iron Ore group in December 2004, with responsibilities for operations and projects in Australia, Canada, Guinea and India, as well as for Dampier Salt and Rio Tinto Marine. Sam is also chief executive of RioTinto Australia and chairman of Rio Tinto China. In June 2009, Sam was appointed as an executive director to the boards of Rio Tinto plc and Rio Tinto Limited. Before joining the Iron Ore group, Sam held a number of management positions within Rio Tinto, including chief executive of the Aluminium group. He has been with Rio Tinto since 1991. Sam has a Bachelor of Commerce from Melbourne University and has completed a Fellowship Program at Kettering University in Michigan. In recognition of his distinguished contribution to business and the community, Sam was appointed as an Officer in the General Division of the Order of Australia and awarded an Honorary Doctor of Commerce in January 2010 by Edith Cowan University.

Let the games begin - the Olympics as an urban regeneration catalyst Bill Hanway, Executive Director Operations, AECOM

With the Olympic Games in London fast approaching, this session looks at how this major sporting and cultural event can be utilised as a regeneration catalyst. As a driving principle, the Olympic Games must deliver a world-class urban development that not only promotes the best in design, technology, sport and culture, but also satisfies more urgent, vital needs intrinsic to local people, businesses and the environment. The session will focus on the work in London – a unique opportunity to regenerate the Lower Lea Valley providing new homes, work space, schools, health and other community facilities; and of course world class sporting facilities. The presentation will also touch on how this approach has been further developed in the recently awarded work for the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro. Bill will give a fascinating insight into how this major sporting event will leave a lasting legacy for London and a starting point for Rio de Janeiro.

With a wealth of experience on urban regeneration projects, new community designs, sports master planning and commercial developments, Bill Hanway is the Executive Director of Operations for AECOM Planning Design + Development, a 5,000 person global team focused on the built environment. Trained and qualified as an architect in the United States, he has been based in the London office since 1997. At the practice level, he provides the design leadership and management of AECOM's multidisciplinary teams and has worked in the UK, Continental Europe, the US and the Middle East. His recent projects include the winning competition entry for the Rio 2016 Olympic Games and Legacy Masterplan, the London 2012 Olympic Games and Legacy Masterplan, a new campus extension for Cambridge University, and the Heart of Doha Masterplan in Qatar. In addition to his role in AECOM, Bill supports the commitment to improving the quality of the built environment through his participation at CABE (Commission for Architecture and the Built Environment), where he is a Vice Chair of the National Design Review Panel.

Patrick Hollingworth, a West Australian, had a passion to climb the highest mountain in the world.

A ten-year apprenticeship served in the world's greatest mountain ranges in Canada, Alaska, France, Pakistan, Nepal and Tibet saw him gain an impressive resume of climbing experiences which enabled him to fulfil his dream in May 2010. Summiting Mount Everest reinforced Pat's conviction that passion, self-belief and a dogged persistence can empower normal individuals to achieve great things. And now he wants to share this knowledge with others. His enthusiasm for his climbing shines through in his presentations, as does his stunning still and video footage from the summits of the world's highest mountains. Patrick demonstrates how any ordinary person can achieve extraordinary outcomes. His words will leave the audience inspired to tackle their own challenges in life, whatever they may be. During the climb Patrick's willingness to openly discuss his previous experiences with depression, and the subsequent raising of awareness for men's health issues, contributed to his expedition being widely followed in the Western Australian community, where high-altitude mountaineers are a rare breed. When he's not climbing mountains, Patrick works as an environmental consultant for RPS, and specialises in conducting environmental impact assessment for marine and coastal infrastructure projects for the oil and gas and land development industries.

Designing 2050 - the property industry in a carbon constrained economy

Dr Peter Ellyard, Futurist

"We don't know what this means" is the common catch cry of the industry when it comes to a carbon economy. Australia @ 35 Million - a thirty year vision for urban development

Professor Richard Weller, University of WA

When released in 2010, Professor Richard Weller's Boom Town 2050 seriously challenged conventional thinking for Perth and provided scenarios for a rapidly growing city that needs at least 700,000 new homes and a doubling of the city's infrastructure in the forty years to 2050. Richard takes this research and applies it to Australia's major population centres in a challenging and provocative presentation that considers how we will house an Australian population of 35 million.

Richard Weller is Winthrop Professor of Landscape Architecture at the University of Western Australia (UWA) and Director of the Australian Urban Design Research Centre. He has received several Excellence in Teaching awards from UWA and a consistent stream of international, design competition awards in over 25 years of design experience. He has published over 70 papers and given invited lectures in the best design schools around the world. His design work has been widely exhibited including in a retrospective at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Sydney (1998) and published as a monograph by the University of Pennsylvania Press in 2005. Professor Weller's recent planning work was published by the UWA Press in 2009 under the title of "Boomtown 2050: Scenarios for a Rapidly Growing City" and his current research concerns urban growth scenarios to meet Australia's predicted mid-century population growth. In 2012 Professor Weller delivered the Annual FL Olmsted lecture at Harvard University.
